The Vision

In 2008, Asolo Repertory Theatre and the FSU/Asolo Conservatory for Actor Training collaborated to launch a new Education & Community Engagement offering: an annual production selected specifically for school audiences. In 2010, the program was reconfigured as a touring production, with the goal of serving as many students as possible, especially those who might not otherwise attend live theatre. Our annual educational tour now brings Shakespeare to eight counties across Florida, with approximately 55 performances scheduled for Fall 2018.

The Partnership

The FSU/Asolo Conservatory for Actor Training, ranked as one of the top ten actor training programs in the country, has been Asolo Repertory Theatre's partner for over 45 years. Twelve students a year are chosen to take part in the intense three-year training program, which combines high-caliber classroom work, guest artist workshops, and professional production experiences.

In the third year of training, before joining Asolo Rep's mainstage company as full-time members, Conservatory students take part in a touring production performed throughout the state for school groups and the general public. The program is not only an invaluable part of the sophisticated training offered by the FSU/Asolo Conservatory for Actor Training, it also represents the ongoing and ever-developing partnership between Asolo Rep and Florida State University.

From the Director Celine Rosenthal



As a child I'd watch characters on stage and think to myself, which one do I want to be? The smart one? The funny one? The brave one? More often than not, the characters who fit those descriptions would be male. The women on stage would be largely silent functions of the male storyline. That always bothered me.

So, when approaching *The Tempest*, a play with only one scripted female character, I started thinking: what happens to this play if more of these

characters are women? Not just male characters played by female actors, but truly female characters. How does that change the narrative and affect the main themes of the play?

This is a story about how we move forward in the world when we have been wronged. It asks us to examine how we choose to use our power; to heal the world or to destroy it?

I have decided, as an artist, that I want to do what I can with my little bit of agency to heal it. And so I ask you as an audience: How does putting that power in female hands change the story for you?

Through this adaptation we are endeavoring to make Shakespeare's plays fresh and alive for young people of all genders who are sitting in an audience today asking the same questions I was asking when a child. I hope now, we can give them different answers.

TYLER DOBROWSKY

(Adapter) is the Associate Artistic Director at Trinity Rep in Providence, RI. Directing credits at Trinity Rep include: A Midsummer Night's Dream, Julius Caesar, A Flea in Her Ear, It's A Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play, Love Alone (a world premiere by the playwright Deb Salem Smith) and A Christmas Carol. Tyler has taught at NYU's Tisch School for the Arts as well as UNC. Tyler teaches in the Brown/Trinity MFA program, serves on the board of Rhode Island Latino Arts and is a proud member of the Stage Directors' and Choreographers' union. He received his MA in Education Policy from Brown University, and studied history, theater and Russian at Holy Cross.

(Director) is an NYU Tisch alum, Tony®-nominated producer (*Leap of Faith, Seminar*), and a New Georges Jammer. She is the recipient of directing fellowships at Manhattan Theatre Club and Asolo Repertory Theatre, as well as an SDCF observership. Recent projects include *Chicago* at Children's Theatre Company in Minneapolis, *Borders in a Bedroom* at The Tamasha Festival (Awarded Best Production), *Drowning in Cairo* at The National Queer Theater, and last season's FSU/Asolo Conservatory production of *The Motherf***r with the Hat*.

In her 80+ dance works, she has collaborated with artists and organizations of various disciplines including Sarasota Orchestra, Choral Artists of Sarasota, Westcoast Black Theater Troupe, Salvador Dalí museum, *Kaleidoscope*, The Ringling Museum, Art Center of Sarasota, Stephen Miles of New Music New College, composer Edward Cosla, percussionist Scott Blum, Mark Dancigers of NOW Ensemble, and the multi-talented Francis Schwartz. Her works have been performed nationally at the John F. Kennedy Center, Ailey Citigroup Theatre in NYC, Colony Theatre, the Jackie Gleason Theater in Miami, and internationally in Rallmah, Argentina, and Spain. Leymis pioneered the Dance and Healing certificate at University of Florida and holds an MFA in Performance/Choreography from Florida State University.
